Foreign exchange

The currency in South Africa is in Rand/ZAR. One Rand (R) = 100 cents (C). Bank notes currently available are R200, R100, R50, R20 and R10 and coins are R5, R2, R1, 50c, 20c and 10c. A traveller is only allowed to carry R25 000 in South African bank notes, whether leaving or entering the country, as long as it is declared to the Customs/Excise officers on arrival.

Whilst you will need some cash with you on arrival for travel costs to the University and to cover general expenses during the first few weeks, you can bring some of your money in traveller's cheques. Otherwise, the majority of shopping centres have the option for debit or credit card transactions.

Climate

The Province of KwaZulu-Natal is famed for its mild, sunny winter climate and year-round 'fun in the water' weather. On the eastern side of South Africa, the province is bordered by the warm Indian Ocean to the east and the high escarpment of the Drakensberg Mountains to the west. It has a warm, sub-tropical climate, with temperatures moderated by the expanse of the Indian Ocean. Summers are hot and humid, averaging 28 degrees celsius, with the majority of the annual rainfall, while winters, with average temperatures of 23 degrees celsius, are warm, dry and clear. There is occasional frost in the interior and snow often falls in the higher reaches in

winter. Winter sunshine averages almost seven hours a day, some of the highest in the country.

The climate in Durban is described as all-year-round tourist-friendly. Sea temperatures are also relatively stable, averaging 21degrees celsius all year, providing possibilities for a diversity of aquatic activities in any season, including diving, fishing, swimming, boating and surfing.

Restaurants

South African cuisine is renowned for its variety, derived from the culinary traditions of diverse people. Many restaurants serve authentic African food and others specialise in 'settler' food — Cape Dutch, Malay, Indian, Chinese, French and Portuguese. There are also plenty of Italian, Greek, Thai, Japanese and other restaurants, along with fast food joints.

Popular local dishes include African stews on phuthu (stiff, crushed corn porridge), bunny chow (curry in a half-loaf of bread) and bobotie (curried mince with onions and eggs), and seafood is always plentiful. Perhaps the most popular South African meal is the braai, a barbecue with meats and boerewors (spicy sausage). To wash it all down, South African wines are among the best in the world, and fine local beers are also available.

Driving in South Africa

Drivers' licences

Drivers' licences obtained from another country may be used in South Africa provided that they have the driver's photograph and are in English. Licences issued in another language must be accompanied by a certificate of authenticity (in English) issued by the bearer's country Embassy, Consular Office or any other competent authority.

Alcohol Limit - Drinking and driving

Your blood limit may not have an alcohol content of more than 0.00%. This means that even after what you may think is a 'small drink', you could be over the limit. If you have more than 350ml of beer, OR if you have more than a single tot of brandy or other spirit, you may already be over the limit. Remember that these levels of alcohol will remain in your system for up to EIGHT hours after consumption!

Do not take chances, rather stay where you are until you have sobered up, or arrange for alternative transport home from wherever you plan to drink, and make such plans in advance to ensure that you are not left stranded.

The South African Police Services (SAPS), together with other State and provincial authorities, are committed to reducing this crime.

No one is trying to stop you from having a good time – just be responsible about doing it!

SAFETY HINTS AND TIPS

It is NOT advisable to:

- Pick up hitchhikers
- Hitchhike
- Take shortcuts through deserted areas
- Keep your car doors unlocked
- Leave your bag or wallet unattended.

We advise that you:

- Carry your medical aid card at all times.
- Store luggage in the car's boot (trunk) where it is out of sight.
- To have RMS escort you to your_car/residence

Safety on the beach

- Swim at beaches manned by lifeguards and between designated swimming beacons.
- The African sun has high levels of UV radiation, so use a high factor sun protection cream.
- Do not take glass or bottles to the beach.
- Avoid drinking alcohol if you are going to be swimming.
- Avoid bringing any valuables to the beach.

MAKING INTERNATIONAL CALLS

To make an international call from South Africa, dial 00, followed by the country code of the country you wish to call, followed by the relevant area code (if there is one), followed by the phone number.

What's my country's dialling code?

One of the quickest ways to find out is to dial Telkom's 24-hour international customer care centre – **10903** – and ask. The service is free. Alternatively, look it up on 'Telkom's international dialling code directory' or go to 'Google' and type in "dialling code [your country]".

Operator-assisted dialling

Telkom's international booked calls – **10900** – offers 24-hour assistance to anyone wanting to make international calls or send faxes.

Opening a resident bank account

To open a resident bank account as a foreign national, it is necessary to:

- Declare all the funds or foreign assets brought into the country
- Complete the Foreign National Declaration and Confirmation of Employment by a South African Employer form
- Provide a written declaration that foreign assets will not be given to a third party resident in South Africa
- Provide the bank with copies of:
- Valid passport
- Work or study permit
- o Proof of address in South Africa such as utility bill
- Copies of recent statements from bank in the home country or solid evidence of banking history

> To apply for an extension/renewal of your existing study visa:

NB: Application should be submitted 60 days before expiry of current visa. Go to the VFS website www.vfsglobal.com/dha/southafrica/

- 1. Click on "Online Application Form"
- 2. Click on "Apply Now"
- 3. It will take you to the next page titled "Schedule an appointment"
- 4. At the bottom of the list click on the "please click here" link
- 5. It will take you to the next page where you will be required to select the following options:
 - a. Application type: Select "Temporary Residence Visa"
 - b. Application sub-type: Select "Corporate Account"
 - c. Application sub-type category: Select "Study Visa Section 13 (CAU)" **This sub-** category is dependent on the type of visa renewal
 - d. Location: Select the office of VFS where you intend to submit your application
 - e. Payment mode: Select the method of payment
 - f. Previous Corporate visa no. : type the reference number of the *current* visa sticker.
- 6. Click "Submit" to complete the transaction.

Create a 'User Profile' for new users. If you have an existing account 'login'

- 1. Click on 'New Application'
- 2. Complete Form
- 3. Schedule an appointment with VFS
- 4. When the date is confirmed, the checklist, completed form and payment details will be accessible. Download and print all the documents.
- 5. Prepare all supporting documents as per the check list and make payment. **NB. THE SOUTH AFRICA POLICE CLEARANCE CERTIFICATE** <u>MUST BE</u> SUBMITTED. A PROOF OF APPLICATION
 WILL NOT SUFFICE.
- 6. Sign the completed form.
- 7. For the appointment take:

- The completed signed application form
- All supporting documents as per the check list
- Proof of payment
- Copy of Passport
- Copy of current visa
